## I. ITS BEGINNING PROPHESIED.

- A. Daniel 2:36-44.
  - 1. The great image in Nebuchadnezzar's dream, Dan. 2:31-35.
    - a. Head of gold. b. Breast and arms of silver.
    - c. Belly and thighs of bronze. d. Legs of iron.
    - e. Feet of iron and clay.
  - 2. The prophesy was not just for Nebuchadnezzar a larger audience.
  - 3. Break down of the kingdoms, Dan. 2:36-43.
    - a. Head Babylonians. b. Breast/arms Medo Persians.
    - c. Belly/thighs Greece. d. Legs Rome.
    - e. Feet divided empire of Rome.
- B. God's Kingdom Established, Daniel 2:44.
  - 1. An eternal kingdom.
    - a. Never destroyed.
    - b. Put an end to all kingdoms.
    - c. Endure forever.
  - 2. Matthew 16:18, "I will build My church..."

#### II. ITS BEGINNING PLANNED.

- A. Laying the Foundation. (At least 600 yrs. later.)
  - 1. John's ministry was *preparational*.
    - a. Two themes:
      - i. Repent, kingdom at hand [near], Matthew 3:2.
      - ii. He who comes, Matthew 3:11.

- 2. Christ's ministry was foundational.
  - a. Christ was born under law.
  - b. Christ lived his life under law.
  - c. But, His words [teachings] pointed to the kingdom to come.
- B. Recognize Four Facts:
  - 1. The establishment of the kingdom was not far away, Mk. 9:1.
  - 2. The establishment of the kingdom would occur in Jerusalem, Lk. 24:46-49.
  - 3. The establishment of the kingdom would be accompanied with power.
  - 4. The Apostles would receive the power, Acts 1:8.
- C. Christ's ministry was to lay the foundation of His kingdom, the church.

# III. ITS BEGINNING PICTURED.

- A. The Day of Pentecost, Acts 2.
  - 1. Prior to Pentecost the church always spoken of in future tense.
    - a. Mark 9:1 the apostles (until it comes...).
    - b. Luke 24:46-49 Jerusalem (until you are clothed).
    - c. Acts 1:6-8 (you shall receive...). Happened, Acts 2:1-4.
  - 2. After Pentecost always spoken of in present tense.
  - a. The church in existence, Acts 8:1, 3; 9:31; 11:22; Colossians 1:13-14.
- B. Peter's Preaching.
  - 1. Evidence that Jesus was Lord and Christ, Acts 2:22-24, 36.
  - 2. Response of multitude, Acts 2:37.
  - 3. Repent and be baptized, Acts 2:38.
  - 4. Three thousand baptized, Acts 2:41, 47 (added to their number).
- D. Faith Based on the Word.
  - 1. God's Word provides the testimony of true faith.
  - 2. Romans 10:17, "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God."
  - 3. If it's not in the Bible, then it must not be true.

  - 1. Ephesians 1:3, "...with every spiritual blessing."
  - 2. 1 John 5:13, "...you know you have eternal life."
