I Am The Only One!

Have you ever felt like you were alone? Maybe at work you felt like you were the only one who does any real work. We can feel isolated like we are the only one going through struggles. The devil uses these feelings to break us down and attack us. We start to feel sorry for ourselves. We may start to resent the people around us who we believe are better off than we are, or who are not helping us when we are working so hard.

I worry that we might feel alone in our Christian walk. Many of the things we do for God are done in private. We are often unaware of all the work that is going on around us by other members. We can end up feeling like "I am the only one" even when we are in a large crowd of other Christians on Sunday morning.

We recently had a lesson about Elijah. Elijah was a worker, a prophet of God. However, he grew to feel isolated and alone. He believed he was the only follower of God left in Israel. He felt he was the only one still doing what was right, and still willing to work for God. "I am the only one..." (I Kings 18:22; 19:10).

God does three things to address Elijah's problem. Elijah is reminded that God is always with us (1 Kings 19:12-13). God tells Elijah to get back to work (1 Kings 19:15-17). Elijah is reminded that there are other faithful followers of God (1 Kings 19:18).

Sometimes we may begin to feel isolated in our own work for God. God will always be with us (Matthew 28:20). We are called to keep working (Colossians 3:17). There are believers all around the world. "...I will build Assembly 10:30 AM Assembly 10:30 AM my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18). We should never forget that the devil wants us to feel like "I am the only one," that is when we are most vulnerable. ~Brad Tolbert

INCONVENIENT

Power was off at the house and church building (and other places) Sunday night until about eleven o'clock Monday morning. Inconvenient! I came into work Tuesday morning ready for a day of working on sermon and class notes and found that the power had knocked out the church internet and phone lines. Inconvenient! Worked for several hours trying to get things righted, using up time I wanted to use for what I considered more important things. Inconvenient!

You get the point, life can be inconvenient at times. We plan out our day or week or month and things change and catch us off guard and we are frustrated because of inconvenience. How could people (or life) be so uncaring and inconsiderate? Of course, James shares with us that we really should know better. "Yet you do not know what your life will be like tomorrow. You are just a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away. Instead, you ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we will live and also do this or that.' But as it is, you boast in your arrogance; all such boasting is evil" (Jas. 4:14-16).

But let's put the shoe on the other foot for a moment. How do we react when we are inconvenienced? I admit I didn't handle the situation Tuesday as I should have. Things worked out and everything was working before I left for the day, but my frustration level was near the boiling point. Why? I must have thought more highly of myself than I should. Isn't that what James pointed out as he drew attention to our arrogance?

And dealing with pride and arrogance, do we sometimes do things based on what we think we have a "right" to do? Do we sometimes show the Lord an arrogance because we should be able to worship as we desire? We should be able to dress for worship to be comfortable (and not inconvenienced for a few moments!). We should be able to do as we like, because we can!

I am so glad that Jesus humbled (inconvenienced) Himself to the point of death on the cross for me (*Phil. 2:5-8*)! ~*P. Mowrer*
