WHAT WILL YOUR ANSWER BE? Will You Really Lay Down Your Life for Me? John 13:31-38

INTRODUCTION

- A. How far are you willing to go for Christ?
- B. For you, is following Christ merely a Sunday stroll?

I. "I AM READY TO DIE FOR YOU."

- A. Peter's Statement of Conviction. John 13:37.
 - 1. Judas has left to complete his act of betrayal, vss. 27-30.
 - 2. Jesus explains His leaving in a short while, vs. 33.
 - 3. Peter will lay down his life for Jesus.
- B. Peter: An Exceptional Success.
 - 1. He was a decisive man.
 - a. He readily accepted the invitation to follow Jesus, Matthew 4:18-20.
 - b. He did not hesitate or offer excuses, but went *immediately*.
 - 2. He was a wholehearted man.
 - a. He knew his mind and his heart.
 - b. He never gave less than 100%.
 - 3. He was a perceptive man.
 - a. He had the quality of truly seeing and hearing.
 - b. John 6:68, "...to whom shall we go?"
 - c. Matthew 16:16, "You are the Christ..."
 - 4. He was a loyal man.
 - a. He was openly, devoutly, and totally committed to Christ.
 - b. Jesus honored this quality:
 - i. He was one of the inner circle of friends.
 - ii. Matthew 16:19, was given the keys of the kingdom.

II. "WILL YOU REALLY LAY DOWN YOUR LIFE FOR ME?"

- A. The Denial of Peter.
 - 1. Jesus prophesies the denial of Peter, vs. 38.
 - 2. Peter is accused of being a follower of Christ, Luke 22:54-62.
 - 3. After his third denial, he hears the cock crow, vs. 61.
- B. Peter: An Exceptional Failure.
 - 1. In the Garden, he ran at the rebuke of using the sword, Matthew 26:56.
 - 2. He denied knowing Jesus while Jesus was on trial, Matthew 26:57-75.
 - 3. He returned to his occupation after the resurrection, John 21.

III. "WHEN ONCE YOU HAVE TURNED AGAIN..."

- A. Peter: More Than a Sunday Stroll.
 - 1. Jesus also prophesied Peter's return, Luke 22:31-32.
 - 2. Fulfillment of the prophecy found in John 21:15-17.
- B. The Remainder of Peter's Life.
 - 1. Reaching out to those that were lost.

- 2. Truly laying down his life for Jesus.
 - a. He was crucified head down in Rome, around 54-56 A.D.

CLOSING

- A. We all have to answer the same question Jesus asked Peter.
 - 1. Will we really lay down our lives for Him?
 - 2. Or will we only stand for Christ until difficulties come our way?
- B. Maybe you have suffered the same fate of Peter.
 - 1. In time of trial you forsook Christ and went your own way.
 - 2. There is forgiveness in Christ, 1 John 2:1-2; 1:9.
