- D. We will concentrate on the two roads.

I. THE WAY TO HELL.

- A. Entrance "Wide is the gate."
 - 1. A road that is inviting.
 - 2. It can be entered with bag and baggage, the gate of self-indulgence.
 - 3. Multitudes can enter all at once, with plenty of room to spare.
 - 4. Satan has made the way to hell a very easy way. He has blinded man from the truth so that man doesn't know which way is right, 2 Corinthians 4:4.
- B. Ease "Broad is the road."
 - 1. Welcome to each person, the more the merrier.
 - 2. There are no restrictions travel as you wish.
 - 3. Paul tells us that man would be lovers of pleasure more than lovers of god, 2 Timothy 3:2-4.
 - a. If you don't believe it, ask yourselves why you aren't present Sunday evening and Wednesday evenings.
 - b. Why you don't have time to work for Christ but time for everything else?
- C. "That leads to destruction."
 - 1. Prov. 14:12, "There is a way which seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death."
 - 2. Psalm 1:6, "...but the way of the wicked will perish."
- D. Enjoyment "Many enter through it."
 - 1. There is pleasure in sin, Hebrews 11:25.
 - 2. The parable of the farmer building bigger barns, Luke 12:19-21.

II. THE WAY TO HEAVEN.

- A. Difficult "Small is the gate."
 - 1. It is a gate that must be found.
 - a. Matthew 6:33, "Seek first His kingdom..."
 - b. Matthew 7:7-8, "...seek and you shall find..."
 - 2. We empty ourselves of the desire for earthly goods, the unforgiving spirit, selfishness and self-righteousness, Mt. 5-7.
 - a. Luke 9:23, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me."
 - 3. The statement of Jesus, John 14:6.

- B. Strict "Narrow is the road."
 - 1. Example of Moses, Hebrews 11:26.
 - 2. Living for God is difficult, John 15:18-19, 2 Cor. 4:8-10.
 - 3. Can be compared to a turnstile only one at a time.
 - 4. Demanding self-denial and obedience.
- C. Salvation "That leads to life."
 - 1. Passing from death unto life, John 5:24.
- D. Surety "And only a few find it."
 - 1. Why only a few? We have to repent and leave our sins.
 - 2. Too often we are comfortable where we are, unwilling to make a change.
 - 3. Romans 7:14-25

III. GOD'S WORD.

- A. The Common Denominator.
 - 1. The psalmist [righteous].
 - a. "I do not forget Your law", vs. 153.
 - b. "I do not turn from Your testimonies", vs. 157.
 - c. "I love Your precepts", vs. 159.
 - 2. The wicked.
 - a. "They do not seek Your statutes", vs.155.
 - b. "They do not keep Your word", vs. 158.
- B. Our Relationship with God.
 - 1. Based on following God's Word.
 - a. Ps. 119:105, "Thy word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my path."
 - b. Psalm 1:3
 - 2. We can know for a fact.
 - a. Are we following His word in all things?
 - b. Do we spend time reading, meditating on His word?
 - c. Are we memorizing His word?
 - i. We know a lot of stats and phone numbers ...
 - ii. But do we truly know God?
 - 3. Knowledge based on God's Word.
 - a. 1 John 5:11-13
 - b. John 14:6, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but through Me."
