AT THE FEET OF JESUS The Incarnation of Christ John 1:1-5, 14

INTRODUCTION

- A. The time of year when much of the world's attention is turned to Christ's birth.
 - 1. Prophecies of old, Isaiah 9:6.
 - 2. The angel's proclamation to Joseph, Matthew 1:21, 23.
- A. The incarnation of Christ is one of the most magnificent facts of all history.
- B. It is the fact which bridged the gal between God and man.
 - 1. The story God Decided to Take on Skin

I. WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

- A. No one preceded Him who was His equal and His like has never been seen since.
 - 1. Gabriel's statement to Mary, Luke 1:35.
 - 2. Angels to the shepherds, Luke 2:11.
 - 3. Claims of Jesus: Jn. 6:38; 12:49
 - 4. His miracles unmatched; healing the sick, calming the storm, raising the dead.
 - 5. His messages tell of His divinity always pointing to heaven.

II. WHY DID HE COME CLOTHED IN HUMANITY?

- A. Adam was made in the image of God, Gen. 1:27; 5:1.
 - 1. After the transgression, Seth was born in the image of Adam, Genesis 5:3.
 - 2. The penalty of sin Genesis 2:17; Romans 6:23.
- B. After the sin of Adam and Eve, it seems to have been two or three hundred years before man called upon God in prayer, Genesis 4:26.
 - 1. After this, Enoch walked with God (Gen. 5:22-24) but there was not the closeness there had been before sin entered the world.
- C. Since the penalty of sin is death someone had to pay the penalty that had no sin of his own, Isaiah 53:4-6.
 - 1. Could this have been done without the life and death of Jesus?
 - 2. Evidently not or God would have done it a better way.
- D. He came as a result of man's ignorance, guilt and mortality.
 - 1. Job asked, "If a man die, shall he live again?" (Job 14:14) NO ANSWER.
 - 2. Socrates and Plato wrestled with the same question.
 - 3. The answer came when Christ was raised from the dead.
- E. Christ came to show us the Father.
 - 1. Man has desired to see God ever since he was banished from the garden.
 - 2. John 14:5-9
- F. He came to preach good tidings, Luke 4:18-19 (cf. Isa. 61:1-2).

III. CHRIST'S INFLUENCE ON THE LIFE OF MAN.

- A. Influence upon childhood.
 - 1. He was a model of humility from the cradle to the grave.
 - 2. He was industrious, Luke 2:49.
 - a. Not only in His heavenly Father's business.
 - b. He was raised as a carpenter, Mark 6:3.
 - 3. He was obedient to His parents, Luke 2:51-52; Eph. 6:1-2.

- B. Influence upon women.
 - 1. Before Christ came, women were in slavery; often, no more than property.
 - 2. His teachings have lifted her up to be a companion rather than a subordinate.
 - a. A return to God's original plan!
 - b. Genesis 2:18, 20 a helpmeet for man.
- C. Influence on the home.
 - 1. He emphasized the worthiness of the home.
 - 2. He stressed:
 - a. The permanence of marriage, Matthew 19:3-9.
 - b. The importance of love, Matt. 22:39; John 13:34-35.
 - c. The relationship which should be between parents and child, Eph. 6:1-4.
- D. Influence on social customs.
 - 1. A new sacredness to human life under some teachings, life is nothing.
 - 2. Marriage today divorce is on the increase, but not because of Christ.
 - 3. In government and law.
 - a. Even though this is not a Christian nation, the influence of the teachings of Christ can still be seen all around us.
 - 4. He would have a great influence upon war if His teachings were followed.

A. God became flesh and dwelt among us, so that we might become more and more like Him.
