ROBBING GOD? Malachi 3:8-12

INTRODUCTION

- A. Traveling a long distance to visit relatives.
 - 1. The first part of the journey peace because of expectations.
 - 2. As the trip wears on unrest!
 - 3. "Are we there, yet!"
- B. Return from Babylon.
 - 1. It has been 70 years from the time the Jews were taken into exile.
 - 2. Ezra and Nehemiah chronicle the return from Babylon.
 - 3. Their work was spurred on by Haggai and Zechariah.
- C. The Preaching of Malachi.
 - 1. Approx. 100 years from the time the people were released to return home.
 - 2. They were tired of the wait for the "Messiah".
 - 3. The people had fallen back into the "same ways" before exile into Babylon.
- D. Two Thousand Years and Still Waiting!
 - 1. Perhaps we find ourselves in the same mindset.
 - 2. Christ promised His return, but here we sit and wait!
 - 3. We may think our worship to the Lord has become mundane boring.
 - 4. There are so many things that vie for our attention.
 - 5. The need to remind us of the commitment we made to the Lord.

I. WE "ROB GOD" BY DISHONORING HIM. 1:6-14

- A. Their Sin.
 - 1. The Jews were robbing God by giving polluted sacrifices.
 - a. Defiled food, 1:7.
 - b. The "blind," lame," and "sick", 1:8, 13-14.
 - c. Animals given which were "good for nothing".
 - 2. Giving polluted sacrifices showed how they "despised" the Lord, 1:6-7, 12.
 - 3. It would be better not to even make sacrifices, because the Lord did not accept these, 1:10, 13.
 - 4. The priests participated in the sin, by accepting the "polluted sacrifices", 1:6.
- B. Our Sin.
 - 1. We can also rob God, by not giving of our best in worship.
 - a. Inferior sacrifice and praise, Heb. 13:15.
 - b. Prepared to come and worship God alert and participating.
 - 2. Romans 12:1, our bodies a living and holy sacrifice.
 - 3. 1 Corinthians 6:15-20 our bodies are joined to the Lord!

II. WE "ROB GOD" BY FAIILING TO TEACH HIS LAW. 2:1-9

- A. Their Sin.
 - 1. The priests were failing to teach the law to the people.
 - 2. Malachi's warnings: God had already cursed them and would further cause them to be shamed and despised, 2:2-3.
 - 3. The role of God's priesthood [Levites] remembered:
 - a. Revere God and stand in awe, 2:5.
 - b. Walk in peace and uprightness and turn many back from their iniquity, 2:6.
 - c. Preserve knowledge so the people would seek instruction from his mouth he was God's messenger, 2:7.
 - 4. The worst part of their sin? They were causing others to stumble from the truth.

- B. Our Sin.
 - 1. We are the chosen priesthood of God, 1 Pet. 2:5, 9.
 - 2. We have the responsibility to teach, Matt. 28:18-20.
 - 3. We must teach the Word correctly, Gal. 1:8-9.
 - 4. When we portray anything other than the truth of God's Word, we cause others to stumble.

III. WE "ROB GOD" BY BREAKING COVENANTS. 2:10-16

- A. Their Sin.
 - 1. They were dealing "treacherously" with others:
 - a. Treacherously "against his brother," 2:10.
 - b. Treacherously with God's sanctuary—"marrying daughters of foreigners," 2:11.
 - i. Implying that their worship was unacceptable because of their wicked dealings with their wives.
 - c. Treacherously with wives of "their youth," 2:14-15.
 - d. They were doing what God hates [divorce], 2:16.
 - 2. God commanded, "Do not deal treacherously," 2:16.
- B. Our Sin.
 - 1. The problem of divorce running rampant in the church today.
 - 2. Becoming too common is the marriage to unbelievers.
 - 3. The need for Christians to marry faithful Christians, 2 Cor. 6:14-18.
 - 4. The need to work hard at keeping our marriages strong "in the Lord."

IV. WE "ROB GOD" BY WITHHOLDING TITHES AND OFFERINGS. 3:8-12.

- A. Their Sin.
 - 1. The people robbed God by not "tithing" properly.
 - 2. God promised blessings if they would change their ways.
- B. Our Sin.
 - 1. We are not required to "tithe" today.
 - 2. But, we are commanded to give as we have been prospered, 1 Cor. 16:1-2.
 - 3. We are commanded to give purposefully and cheerfully, 2 Cor. 9:7.
 - 4. When we give as God desires, we can expect blessings, 2 Cor. 9:8-10.
 - 5. We give, not for the expected blessings, but to show our love for the Lord and His goodness.

V. WE "ROB GOD" BY ARROGANTLY REFUSING TO SERVE HIM. 3:13-4:6.

- A. Their Sin.
 - 1. They were considered "arrogant" because they claimed it was "vain to serve God."
 - 2. They were not being rewarded as those who did wrong, 3:13-15.
 - 3. God reminded them through Malachi, "They will be Mine...," 3:16-18.
- B. Our Sin.
 - 1. Perhaps the thought that doing God's will has become useless.
 - 2. We need to understand that serving Christ makes a difference:
 - a. Believing in Christ, Jn. 8:24.
 - b. Repenting of our sins, Lk. 13:3.
 - c. Being obedient to the gospel, 2 Thess. 1:8-9.
 - d. Live faithful lives for the Lord, Rev. 2:10.
 - 3. There is coming a day of separation!
